Dear Parent or Guardian of Ronald Weasley

Recent legislation strengthened the Ohio Third Grade Reading Guarantee to give greater emphasis to reading instruction and intervention in the early grades. Through this initiative, school districts are required to diagnose reading deficiencies by administering a diagnostic assessment to all students in kindergarten by November 1st, and students in grades one, two or three by September 30th. Columbus City Schools administers an assessment called i-Ready, a computer-adaptive, individually-administered test designed to assess early literacy skills.

Student results on the i-Ready assessment were defined and categorized as on-track or not on-track. A student receiving a designation as on-track is any student meeting the required score for first grade of 378 or second grade of 440. Third grade is

unique in that students must score a 700 on their fall or spring Ohio State Test in English/Language Arts by state standard your child may or may not be on track. See one of two reasons checked below.		
You are receiving this letter because based upon the iReady assessment: O Your child has been identified as <i>not on-track</i> in the area of reading for his/her current grade level. O This plan was developed to document your child's progress to ensure continued literacy growth and success.

The Third Grade Reading Guarantee also requires schools to develop a Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan for students identified as <i>not on-track</i> based on the i-Ready assessment.		
In addition to the above actions, during the 2020-2021 school year only, no district shall retain a student in the third grade who does not meet the promotion score of 683 on the Ohio's State Test for grade 3 English language arts if the student's principal and reading teacher agree that other evaluations of the student's skills in reading demonstrate the student is academically prepared to be promoted to the fourth grade. This provision applies to students who are in third grade for the 2020-2021 school year and would be enrolling in the fourth grade for the 2021-2022 school year, unless retained. If a third grade student scores below the expected level of reading competency on Ohio's State Test in English Language Arts (ELA), he/she will be eligible to take the iReady Reading assessments as an alternative.		
It has always been the goal of Columbus City Schools to meet the educational needs of our students. Accordingly, it is imperative that we continue to work collaboratively to ensure the success of our students.
