Course Numbering Guidelines

Courses at Columbus City Schools are numbered using certain guidelines to easily identify certain attributes of a course by looking only at the number.

General Information:

- All course numbers are six digits in length and may contain a letter at the end, based on specific course attributes.
 - 0 242501 ADV QUANTITATIVE REASONING
 - 242501B ADV QUANTITATIVE REASONING (Semester Block)
- Course numbers beginning with three five (3-5) are placeholders and do not represent courses granting credit i.e. 399994 LUNCH 4.
- Course names should be in ALL CAPS.
 - Arabic numerals are utilized to indicate a grade level i.e. COMMON CORE MATH 6
 - Roman numerals are utilized to indicate course level i.e. SPANISH IV

All Elementary (K-5) course numbers:

- First digit is a zero (0).
- Second digit denotes grade level (1-5).
- Third digit denotes content area:

5	Technology	9	World Language

• The remaining digits may be utilized to create the unique identifier for the course.

All Middle School (6-8) course numbers:

- First digit is a one (1).
- Second digit denotes content area.

3	Social Studies	7	Music
4	Math	8	Health/Physical Education
5	Technology	9	World Language

- Third digit is a zero "0"
- Fourth digit denotes grade level (6-8).
- The remaining digits may be utilized to create the unique identifier for the course.

All High School (9-12) course numbers:

- First digit is a two (2), the exception to this are courses beginning with eight (8), which represent PSEO/Dual enrollment courses.
- Second digit denotes content area.

- Third digit is a zero "0"
- The remaining digits may be utilized to create the unique identifier for the course.
